Some sources quote him having a third forename; Farmer
Was in the Army Service Corps before going to Woolwich Arsenal
Made his Arsenal debut in a 1-0 win over Everton in March 1911
Was an Army reservist and was called up just before the commencement of WW1
Served with the British Expeditionary Force and fought at Mons in 1914, after which he was discharged and returned home
Was recalled to fight in November 1916 and was recorded as Driver Peart and elsewhere as Corporal Peart
Served with 667 Horse Transport Reserve Depot Company and 4th Division Train Supply Column with service number T/20352
Won a London Combination championship medal with Brentford in 1918-19
Appeared at least 30 times for Margate in 1921-22, without scoring, but left after a few games of the 1922-23 season
