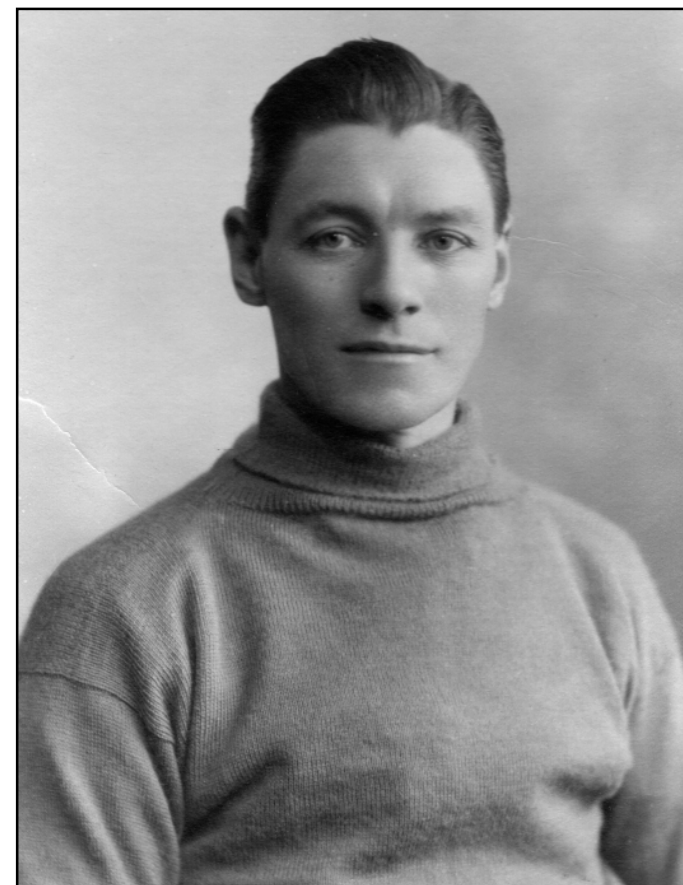

<i>Jottings</i>
Served for five years in South Africa with the South Staffordshire Regiment and won the South Africa Medal in the Boer War
Played against the Corinthians at Ladysmith in 1903 when the famous amateurs toured South Africa
Transferred from the South Staffordshire Regiment to the Army Medical Corps, apparently following injury in South Africa
Played for the Aldershot Depot side that won the Army League two years in succession (1906-1908)
Won the cup in 1907 for the best all-round sportsman at Aldershot for the most points gained in all sports
Played two seasons of non-league football for Walsall
Appeared for Croydon Common in 2 minor cup matches
Played for Wilkinsons in the London Munitions League in 1917-18 and won a London Combination championship medal with Brentford in 1918-19
Was given a benefit match by Brentford and 6,000 attended (v. Millwall in the Southern League on 1.9.1919)
Was selected for the Southern League v. Irish League in October 1919
Played in Queens Park Rangers' first ever Football League match (1-2 at home to Watford on 28.8.1921 in Division 3)
Was a clerk in the League of Nations Union in later life
Lived at 22 Leigham Drive, Osterley, Isleworth from his playing days at Brentford and QPR until his death
